

Downloading eBrary eBook Chapters onto a Kindle

Step 1: Access the eBrary website

On your computer, access the eBrary website from the library's Information Resources page. You may be asked to sign-in using your CLU username and password if you are off campus.

Step 2: Search for an item or find one by subject

Type in your search terms to find a specific item or topic, or search for an item by subject.

Step 3: Search for an item or find one by subject

When results show up, click the download button for the item you want to read on your Kindle.

Step 4: Select the chapter or page range to download

Decide if you want to download an entire chapter or a specific page range (*downloading an entire eBook to put on a Kindle is not accessible*) and then click OK. Downloaded files will appear on your desktop or in your 'Downloads' folder.

Create an image PDF of pages to (maximum 60 pages)

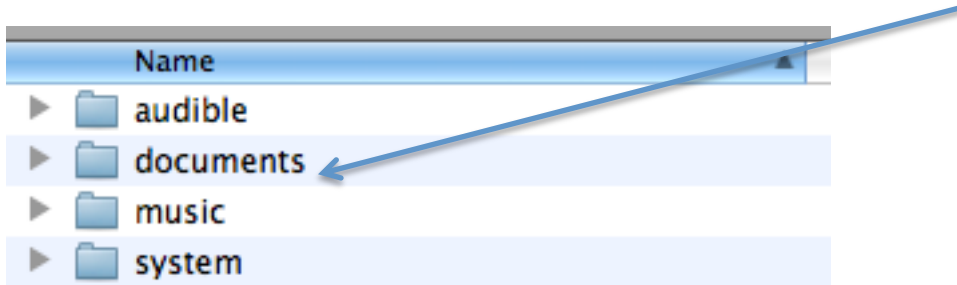
- Accessible on most computers and devices, including the Kindle, without additional software

Step 5: Connect Kindle

Connect your Kindle to your computer with the USB cable and open up the drive in your My Computer or on your desktop.

Step 6: Drag PDF into documents folder on Kindle

Find the PDF document that you saved. Drag and drop it into the documents folder on your Kindle.



Step 7: Eject your Kindle

Eject your Kindle. The PDF(s) should be on your home screen.
